WHEREAS in conformity with the Laws now in force for the Sale of Crown Lands in our Territory of
NEW SOUTH WALES and our Royal Instructions under our Signet and Sign Manual issued in pursuance thereof

Francis Hart of Town of Ipswich
has become the Purchaser of the Allotment or Parcel of Land hereinafter described, for the Sum of Twenty

nine pence Sterling Now Know Ye That for and in consideration of the said Sum for
and on Our behalf well and truly paid into the Colonial Treasury of Our said Territory before these Presents are
issued And in further consideration of the Quit-Rent hereinafter Reserved WE HAVE GRANTED and for Us Our
Heirs and Successors Do HEREBY GRANT unto the said Francis Hart

His Heirs and Assigns Subject to the several and respective Reservations hereinafter mentioned ALL THAT
Allotment or Parcel of Land in Our said Territory containing the measurement one acre and
one rood and or less situated in the Town of Ipswich
Parish of Ipswich County of Queensland
being Allotment No. Twenty of Section No. nine

being situated at the West Corner of allotment number nineteen
and bounded on the North West by two Chains of Martin Street South
Westward, on the North East by a line at right angles dividing it from
allotment number twenty one South Eastward, on the South
East by a line parallel to Martin Street dividing it from allotments
numbers eight and nine, on the North Westward by a line at right angles
to Martin Street, dividing it from allotment
number nineteen North Westward, two Chains to the point of Com-
measurement being the allotment lot 20 in pursuance of
the proclamation of 20th December 1853.

with all the Rights and Appurtenances whatsoever thereto belonging To Hold unto the said Francis
Hart his Heirs and
Assigns for ever YIELDING and Paying therefore Yearly unto Us Our Heirs and Successors the Quit-Rent of One
Penny per acre for ever if demanded; And We DO HEREBY RESERVE unto Us Our Heirs and Successors and to the
Governor for the time-being of Our said Territory by such Person or Persons as shall be by them or Him authorised
in that behalf full power to make and conduct through the said Land all Common or Public Drains and Sewers
which may be deemed expedient: In Testimony Whereof We have caused this Our Grant to be Sealed with
the Seal of Our said Territory.
