

SKEGGS FAMILY HISTORY

1700 Skeggs Family in Anstey Hertfordshire

The Skeggs surname, variously spelt Skiggs, Skegg, Skeges, Skeck and others, is an unusual surname, but widely recorded in the north of England. In the 19th century Skeggs was a fairly common name in Hertfordshire, where our known Skeggs ancestors originated. It is an interesting example of how surnames were gradually created from the habitual use of nicknames. These nicknames were originally given with reference to a variety of personal characteristics, such as physical attributes or peculiarities, and mental and moral characteristics. The derivation, in this instance, is from the Old Norse byname "Skegg", "Beard", denoting someone with a particularly bushy beard. The "s" added at the end denotes "son of Skegg".

Our Skeggs family history can be traced to Hertfordshire, a County to the north of London. The villages of Anstey and Barkway figure prominently as places of residence in the early 1800's, Thomas Skeggs later moving to Bedfordshire to the North West of London.

Mary Skeggs dies in 1788 in Anstey Hertfordshire, aged just 35.

1791 Marriage of Richard Skeggs to second wife Sarah Brown

After the death of his first wife Mary (nee Pallet) in 1788, Richard Skeggs marries Sarah Brown (born 1770).

1791 Children to Richard and Sarah Skeggs

John was named after Richard's first son John who he had with Mary, but who had died aged 18 in 1790.

Sarah Skeggs dies in 1802 in Anstey, Hertfordshire

1794 BIRTH OF JOHN SKEGGS

John Skeggs is born 2th Oct 1794 to Richard Skeggs and his second wife Sarah Brown

1805 Birth of Sarah Oakman

Sarah Oakman is born in Brent Pelham, a small village near Anstey, in 1797. The Oakmans came from Brent Pelham and Albury in Hertfordshire and Sarah's family can be traced back to the 1500's with the birth of Raphe Oakman in 1577.

1816 Marriage of John Skeggs and Sarah Oakman

John Skeggs and Sarah Oakman were married in Brent Pelham on the 14th November 1816.

1818 to 1829 Children of John and Sarah Skeggs

John and Sarah Skeggs have 7 children. Daughter Mary Skeggs was born in 1818 Brent Pelham before they moved to Anstey, where John Skeggs had lived. Their other 6 children were all born in Anstey

1841 to 1871 Census Residences of John and Sarah Skeggs

1841 Census

The 1841 Census reveals John and Sarah Skeggs are living in Anstey, just one house away from the house of George and Mary Barker, Sarah Barkers parents. There is no Mary Skeggs, nor Thomas Skeggs listed at the residence, nor is Sarah Barker listed as living at her parents place.

In fact the Anstey Parish records indicate John Skeggs should have been age 47 (born 1794), and Sarah age 44 (born 1797) and the children should have been aged - William (19), George (17), James (15), Hester (14) and Richard (12) at the time of the 1841 Census, being born is 1822,1824, 1826, 1827 and 1829 respectively. Clearly many the Census data is not always entirely accurate, people in those days not being literate and perhaps not knowing exactly when they were born.

1851 Census

John Skeggs (Skiggs in Census), is living in Cottered. His wife Sarah had died in 1846, and he is living with his grandson George age 11, probably near his relatives as there were several Skeggs families who lived in Cottered.

1846 Death of Sarah Skeggs

Sarah Skeggs Died in 1846 in Herefordshire. Perhaps this is why Thomas Skeggs, her son, moved to Luton in 1847, and John Skeggs her husband moved to Cottered.

1863 Death of John Skeggs

John Skeggs died in Layston Hertfordshire on the 4th April 1863

1820 BIRTH OF THOMAS SKEGGS

There is no birth registration or baptismal records for Thomas Skeggs. But according to the Census of 1841, 1851, 1861, 1871,1881 he consistently states he was born about 1821, in either Anstey or Barkway Hertfordshire. The most likely date is 1820 in Brent Pelham where his father John Skeggs and mother Sarah, were married but a search of the Brent Pelham and Anstey records did not reveal this. We note that his 2 brothers George and James were respectively 16 and 14 years later after birth, in 1840, by which time Thomas had probably left home.

The marriage certificate of Thomas Skeggs and Sarah Barker confirms that Thomas Skeggs is the son of John Skeggs, and the witness to the marriage was William Skeggs, his younger brother.

1824 Sarah J Barker born

Sarah J Barker was born 4th March 1824 to parents George and Mary Barker in Anstey. Sarah Barker appears in the 1841 Census as a Farm Servant aged 15 with John and Mary Morris

1843 Thomas Skeggs and Sarah Barker are married

Thomas Skeggs and Sarah Barker were married on 29th January, 1843, in the Parish of Anstey, and the marriage registered in Royston in Jan-Feb-Mar of 1843. The handwritten Marriage Bann states that the first asking was Jan 15th, the second, Jan 22nd and the third Jan 29th. The 3 askings were required to ensure that any person who objected to the marriage had time to have their say.

1843 to 1861 Thomas and Sarah have 6 children

They have 6 children. Their first three children Eliza, Mary Ann and William were all Baptised in Anstey, though at the time Mary Ann was born, it was stated that they lived in Barkway, an adjoining village. In about 1848/1849 they moved to Stopsley Luton, Bedfordshire where their next three children, Sarah, James and William were born. The first William born 1847 died in 1850, and as it was customary to call another child the same name as the one who had died, their sixth child born 1860 was also called William. James was born in between the two Williams.

Living in Stopsley, Luton, Bedfordshire, It's not clear why William Skeggs is listed here when he had died in 1850 aged 2. Perhaps it was tradition to list all family members, alive or dead. There appeared to be no other families of Skeggs living in Luton at the time so its likely they went to Luton for work. William died of cholera in Luton where there had been a cholera outbreak on 1847/1848.

1861 Census

Thomas Skeggs and family are living at Stopsley Luton Bedfordshire (Note 1st William and Sarah have now died). Why James is aged 10 and William aged 5? I think it was the other way round, James 5 and William probably 10 months, not 10 years as he was born in the 3rd Quarter of 1860. Very confusing, but what is clear is that in both 1850 and 1861 in Luton, there is the death of "a" William Skeggs so I believe that both died, the first aged 2, the second aged 1 year. In the 1971 Census, there is no William Skeggs present.

1871 Census

Sarah and son James living in Sedlescombe, Kent AND strangely on the Census page before, a person called James Skeggs born 1821 in Anstey appears. On closer inspection of the handwritten entry it appears that the J for James could be a T, the second letter "a" has been overwritten so could be a "ho", and the second last letter "e" in James, has a curve over it implying it is broadened to an "a". These 3 changes make "James" look like a "Thomas", and besides there's no other Thomas Skeggs with similar details in any 1871 Census. I think the Census scriber probably started writing James Skeggs, as it is customary for the head of the household to be written first, then realising he is the son and not the head, changed it to Thomas.

1881 Census

Living in High Road Arkley, Chipping Barnet with wife and grand daughter (mother Eliza died 1875) but next door to daughter Mary Ann Skeggs and her husband George Smith and their children

Caroline Philips born abt 1868 Stopsley (grand dter, child of Eliza & James Philips)

1891 Census

1900 Thomas Skeggs Death

The 1891 Census was the last time Thomas Skeggs appeared in a Census, at which stage he was living in Redbourne, St Albans. There is a death registration in 1900 of Thomas Skeggs in St Albans, the registration district for Redbourne, which we presume is him, as he doesn't appear in the 1901 Census.

1855 BIRTH OF JAMES SKEGGS

James Skeggs was born in Stopsley Luton, on 15th April 1855.

1855 – 1871 James Skeggs lives in Stopsley and Seddlescombe

In the 1861 Census, James is with his family in Stopsley Luton, aged 10, but as explained, I believe he was 5 and William 10 months. In 1871 he is living with his mother Sarah (Dairy woman) and father Thomas (Cow Man), in Sedlescombe in the south of England – why there?. Maybe after the death of daughter Sarah (1852) and their second William (1861), and with Mary Ann married (George Smith 1866) and Eliza married (James Philips 1862), only James is home and its time for a change, Seddlescomb being 10k from Hastings on the English Channel.

1876 James Skeggs marries Naomi Gallant (nee Bean)

On the 13th August 1876 James Skeggs marries Naomi Gallant (nee Bean) in Barnet. He is just 21 years old and Naomi is 30. Naomi was born Naomi Bean in 1846 in Rye Sussex, and had been married before to Edward Gallant, born 1841. They were married in 1865 in Shoreditch London and had a daughter, Naomi born 1869 and son Edward born 1872, who died age 2 in 1874. In 1876, Naomi's husband Edward Gallant died in April-May-June in Pancras, aged 35 years when daughter Naomi was 7 years old. Just 4 months later, James married Naomi.

In 1928, James Skeggs Dies aged 73 at Barnet, Edmonton Middlesex.

1877 BIRTH OF CHARLES SKEGGS

On the 24th March 1877, Charles Skeggs of Union Street Barnet South Mims, Middlesex is born to parents James and Naomi Skeggs.

1885 Gertrude Beatrice Bell is born

On the 23rd July 1885, Gertrude Beatrice Bell is born at 6 Woodside Cottages Muswell Hill Road, Highgate, Hornsey, to parents Henry Bell and Eizabeth Bell (nee Adams)

1895 Charles Skeggs joins Royal Artillery

On 27th March 1895, Charles joins the Royal Artillery as a recruit. His attestation record indicates he was an 18 year old shoeing smith and that he signed for 12 years. The Royal Artillery at the time was in Woolwich London.

1899 to 1905 Charles and Emma Skeggs are married and live in Barnet

On 29th October 1899, Charles Skeggs married Emma Richardson in Lyonsdown by Marriage Banns. Emma was born in 1876 in Enfield Middlesex and in 1891 was a 15 year old servant in Leicester Rd Lyonsdown, Barnet. In the 1901 Census, Charles and Emma Skeggs are at Albion Place, Bell's Hill, Chipping Barnet. This street doesn't exist anymore, however, the neighbouring streets in the Census indicate it was only a few hundred metres from 30 High St Barnet where Charles previously lived with his parents James and Naomi and not far from Leicester Rd Lyonsdown where Emma had been a servant. It's not known if Charles continued in the Royal Artillery.

1906 to 1911 Charles Skeggs and Gertrude Beatrice Bell are together then married

About 1906, Charles left his first wife Emma (or vice versa) and met Gertrude Beatrice Bell who had recently separated from her first husband Albert Edward Walton whom she had married on 9th October 1905. Charles and Gertrude moved to Uxbridge where their son James Henry was born 17th January 1909.

On 4th March 1911, Charles a Gertrude Beatrice Bell officially married in St Pancras, London, listing their marital status and bachelor and spinster respectively.

In the 1911 Census, it is noted that they had been married for 7 years and on the birth certificate of their first daughter Mavis Skeggs born in 1914 in Australia, it was noted that they married in St Pancras London on 4th March 1905. However the original marriage certificate notes that Charles and Gertrude were married the 4th March 1911. It's likely that the date was changed to protect son James knowing that his father Charles had previously married.

What happened to the first spouses of Charles and Gertrude? I have found no trace of Albert Edward Walton, but Emma Skeggs was living in 1911 at 23 High St Barnet with the Parsloe family almost next door to the parents of Charles Skeggs. She stated she had been married for 11 years with no children. This line was crossed out, not because it was incorrect, but the Census collector had deemed it inappropriate, not being married to the head of the family. After that, I have found no trace of Emma Skeggs.

1911 - 1914 Census/Electoral Roll Residences of Charles and Gertrude Skeggs

Soon after Charles and Gertrude Skeggs were married in March 1911 they moved to Brisbane Australia. The shipping records lists Chas Skeggs, wife and son Chas (should be James) leaving London on 4th May 1911.

Census UK 1911

In the April 2nd 1911 Charles, Gertrude and son James were living at 96 High St Uxbridge Middlesex UK. He is listed as a shoeing smith

Australian Electoral Roll 1913

In 1913, Charles and Gertrude Skeggs are living in Camperdown NSW, so we presume they emigrated to Sydney that year before moving to Queensland. (Likely 1911)

Australian Electoral Roll 1914 and 1915

In 1914 and 1915, Charles and Gertrude Skeggs and daughter Mavis, were living in Cabbage Tree Creek near Ipswich, Queensland, later called Lake Manchester. It was renamed in December 1916 when the new dam was opened. Charles is listed as a blacksmith.

Australian Electoral Roll 1922

In 1922, Charles and Gertrude had moved to Muirlea on the outskirts of Brassall.

Australian Electoral Roll 1922 to 1937

For 15 years Charles, Gertrude and 2 daughters live at Pine Mountain Road Brassall.

Australian Electoral Roll 1939 to 1954

Charles and Gertrude Operate a boarding house at 11 Smith Street North Ipswich.

Australian Electoral Roll 1954 to 1967

Charles Skeggs died in 1948, and in 1952 Gertrude moved to live with daughter Mavis and husband Harold Gurd to 12 Tallon Street West Ipswich and in 1963, with them to Cascade Street Raceview.

1914 - 1918 Charles and Gertrude Skeggs have 2 children

Apart from James, son of Charles and Emma (his previous wife) there are two more children, Mavis Gertrude Skeggs and Florence Beryl Skeggs born to Charles and his second wife Gertrude Beatrice.

James Henry Skeggs Born 1909 Uxbridge, Middlesex (mother Gertrude Skeggs nee Bell)
